





# Pony Club & Periods





-	/ findings
333	Female riding members aged 10-17 participated in our survey.
69%	Said their Club/Centre has a bin in the toilet where they can dispose of pads/tampons.
38%	Said their Club/Centre has running hot water in the toilets.
5%	Said that sanitary products are available at their Club or Centre. • 3% didn't have to ask anyone to get them.
40%	Said the rules of their Club/Centre required them to wear white, light or pale coloured riding pants for <i>all</i> activities and events.
76%	<ul> <li>Have worried about people knowing they had their period whilst they were riding.</li> <li>91% worried more when they were wearing white/light riding pants.</li> </ul>
62%	Said that concerns about people knowing they had their period distracted them from focussing on riding.
75%	Have changed their mind about doing a Club/Centre non-competitive activity like a rally/muster/lesson/clinic because they were worried people would know they had their period.



On the right side of the My Profile page, click on the three dots next to the club's name and select the Transfer option. (Please only do this for the club and NOT for the zone and the state)


Check if the current club displaying is the correct one, click on the Club Finder button to find your new club, describe in the box why your need to be transferred, and click Save.

# **Meet the Coach**



#### Tarryn Jenkins Yandina Pony Club Queensland, Chief Instructor

Tarryn started riding in New Zealand, before she could walk. Tarryn's mum, Sharon was Chief Instructor Carterton Pony Club in NZ's North Island. Her first pony, when she was 2 years old, was 'Troy' a coloured Shetland. He was an expert in ducking on his knees, climbing under the fence and charging across the creek as the ultimate escape artist.

Sharon has had a profound influence on Tarryn's riding journey. When they moved to Australia when Tarryn was 13, Sharon taught and rode to a high level in eventing and educated and train horses for other people. Tarryn watched it all, and was often thrown on project horses and told to sit there and hold on; her mum just needed 'a weight on its back'!

When her Chief Instructor at Buderim asked Tarryn to give some theory lessons to the kids as part of her doing her B Certificate, it led to her continuing to study to be a coach. Then the instructor said she was doing such a good job that she suggested she did her coach training. When the coach retired, the club asked her step up. She's been a Chief Instructor at one club or another since 2005. While eventing is fun and a passion for Tarryn, she's just as happy to do games and any other discipline. She really loves teaching flatwork at Pony Club® and tries to make it fun and relevant to the riders and their riding preference. Often members who jump, just want to jump, so Tarryn will work on lengthening and shortening strides, so they can work out their jumping strides. She loves to make flat work relevant to all disciplines.

Her tip for instructors is that if you say 'theory' to kids, they'll all groan. But making games out of it and ensuring it's fun, means they're going to learn a lot more. One game she plays create teams to pull a bridle apart, and first to put back together wins. Also using a parent who isn't so horsey as the person who puts it together following instructions from the riders, can be great for little kids who may struggle to do up buckles and also offers an inclusive way for children with disabilities.

One of Tarryn's favourite things about Pony Club ® is the community and knowing you're not alone in your equestrian journey. There's always someone to ask for help or get a second opinion. She loves the education that she can help give, especially to new riders.

Tarryn recently created the club's first eventing camp, where the final day was unfortunately rained out. Instead, she got all the coaches to do a master class where one of the coaches rode their horse in a showjumping and dressage class and the other coaches coached her and explained what they were looking for. Competition manipulation and wagering is particularly important in sports where betting on outcomes is a part of the sport. Within Pony Club this policy may seem irrelevant however it is important to ensure our competitions are run fairly and truly.

Ensuring you are aware of the policy, ensuring all competitions are run fairly and not allowing betting on Pony Club events or competitions.

# What is the Competition Manipulation & Wagering policy?

This Policy is designed to keep sport fair by protecting sporting competitions from competition manipulation (also known as match-fixing) and associated betting activity.

The Policy includes definitions of Prohibited Conduct regarding sports betting and competition manipulation, provides direction on how to report concerns, and sets obligations on National Sporting Organisations who have commercial arrangements with Wagering Service Providers (WSP).
