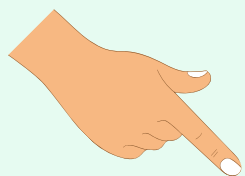

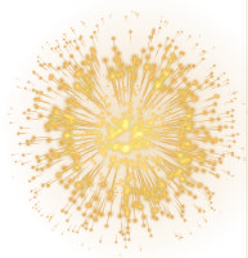

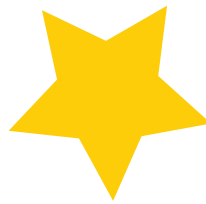

# Equitana Extravaganza



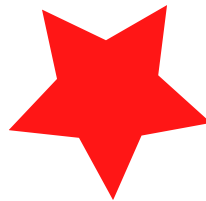

# National Gear Rules draws big response

The release of the [2023 edition of the National Gear Rules](#) (first edition was July 2022) has caught the attention of equestrians around the world, some of whom comment and share our weekly horse welfare and equitation science-based Facebook and Instagram posts as well. The latest changes to the Gear Rules, which had input from all States, have been well received by our members as well.

Don't forget:

- They apply to all members throughout Australia, for rallies, musters and competition, and will be updated (for new gear etc) annually
- You can use the 2022 edition as long as you also read [the Appendix](#), which brings you up to date with the 2023 changes
- There are exemption forms for those who have a good case for using gear not in the Rules; these are submitted online.

## The Healing Powers of Horses and Ponies

From Pony Club UK comes this lovely story:

"I'm DC of the Curre Hunt branch. Back in June last year we started to host a family fleeing the war in Ukraine (mum, dad and two children Milana 9 & Mykyta 6.

"Their home in Kharkov City has seen some of the worst suffering of the war there.

They had never encountered horses before but were soon firm friends with the equine residents at home and helping with all the yard jobs after I hurt my leg in a fall. Of course Milana was soon in the saddle and coming to Pony Club rallies. Both children have already competed in our branch triathlon!

Milana wears her Pony Club kit with great pride. Testament to the healing power of horses and inclusivity of Pony Club. "

- Worm faecal egg count (FEC) service for horses and livestock.

## A Wet Spring and the Effect on Worms

In spring, parasites in horses should be managed by getting a faecal worm egg count (FEC) performed to determine if they need to be dewormed.

Not all horses need to be treated, and so it is better to avoid using deworming drenches rather than use them unnecessarily, as this can lead to drug resistance.

In spring, when the weather warms but remains damp, the development of worm eggs passed in manure into larvae that will reinfect horses occurs quickly – in some cases this can occur in as little as four days.

A large population of infective larvae will build up on the pasture: remember that of all the worms on your property, 90% of those worms are free-living larvae on the grass. These larvae will survive for up to six months in the environment if it is damp enough.

Therefore, it is best to manage worm infections in a way that decreases this larvae population, rather than attempting to eliminate the smaller population of adult worms within the horse. Management of larval populations can be accepted through manure pickup and by deworming horses that are shedding high numbers of worm eggs.

It is recommended to check horses via FEC in early spring and deworm those with high egg counts, as this will decrease the contamination of pastures over the spring period.

However, this year across Eastern Australia, it has been a very wet spring, which looks likely to carry over into summer. Therefore, there will be a risk of high larval loads on pasture, as the warm, damp weather provides optimal conditions for worm larvae survival.

If your horses were checked via FEC at the start of spring, or dewormed in early spring, it may now be worth having them re-checked via FEC to determine if they need another treatment.

If you have not checked your horses this spring, it is worth checking your horses for high egg counts and/or high worm burdens from grazing pastures with higher larval loads than normal this spring.

## Introducing new accredited riding centres to the Pony Club® family

Phoenix Acres Equine Centre (right) has just been announced as the 2022 PCA Accredited Centre of the Year!

The Centre has achieved a lot with their Pony Club Program over 2022.

A sign up day in January, then a start up camp, helped 30 junior riders and two senior riders prepare for rallies and know what to expect.

### NATIONAL INTEGRITY FRAMEWORK COMPLAINTS PROCESS

Pony Club signed onto the National Integrity Framework effective from the 1 JULY 2022. Breaches of the Member Protection, Child Safeguarding, Improper Use of Drugs and Medicines and Competition Manipulation and sports wagering policies will now be managed by Sport Integrity Australia, an independent and impartial body.

If your complaint is not regarding a breach of the National Integrity Framework policies then raise your concerns with Pony Club. Pony Club has many rules and policies that all aim at making Pony Club a fair, safe and fun place to learn about horses and horse riding!

**NATIONAL INTEGRITY FRAMEWORK COMPLAINTS, DISPUTES AND DISCIPLINE POLICY**

**Overview**

The *Complaints, Disputes and Discipline Policy* provides sport and its participants with an independent and impartial complaint management process run by Sport Integrity Australia.

This means when someone wants to make a formal Complaint about allegations of Prohibited Conduct, it will be Evaluated and Assessed independently by Sport Integrity Australia. This removes any risk of a conflict of interest or perceptions of bias.

The *Complaints, Disputes and Discipline Policy* sets out the process for how Complaints will be managed by Sport Integrity Australia, including how disputes will be Finalised and Sanctions imposed.

**What issues will Sport Integrity Australia manage?**

Under the Policy, Sport Integrity Australia will look into any issue defined as 'Prohibited Conduct' within these policies:

- ✔ Child Safeguarding Policy
- ✔ Member Protection Policy
- ✔ Competition Manipulation and Sport Wagering Policy
- ✔ Improper Use of Drugs and Medicine Policy
- ✔ National Integrity Framework.

**What does Sport Integrity Australia not manage?**

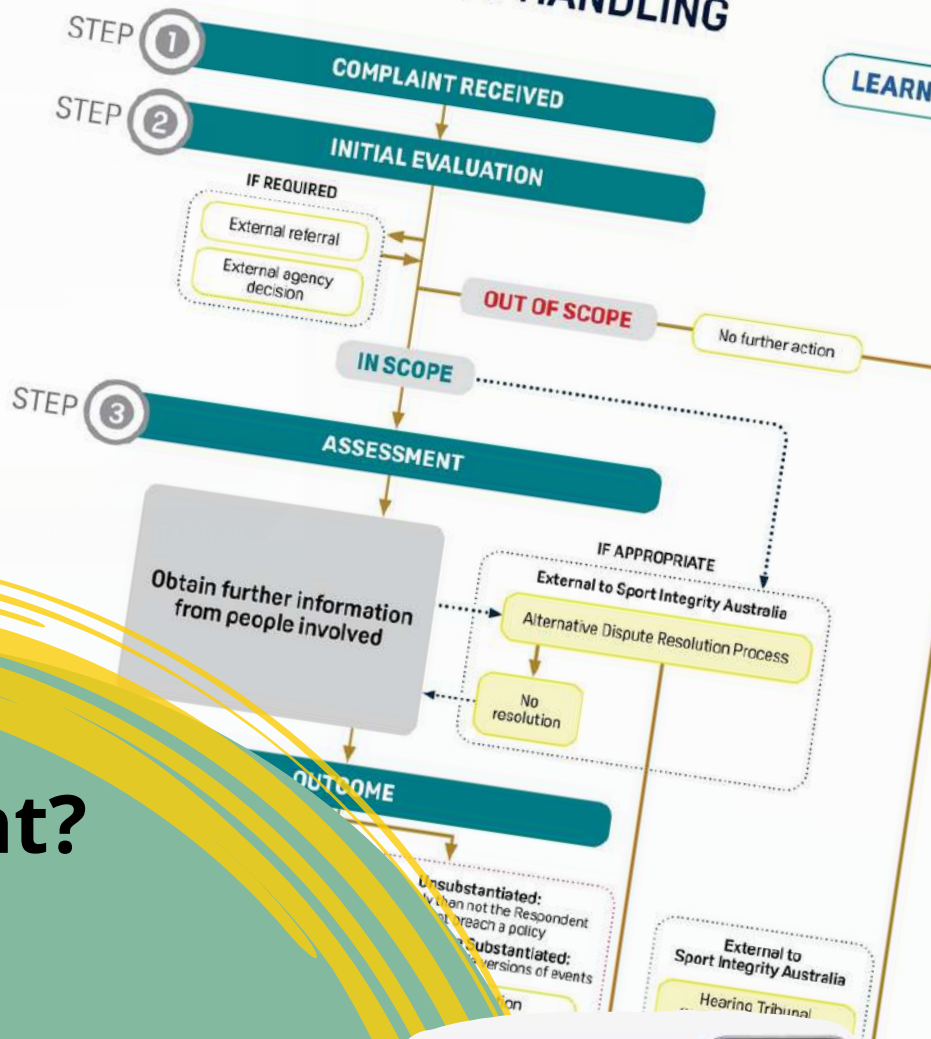
Sport Integrity Australia does not manage complaints in relation to eligibility and competition-related rules, conduct or governance by the sport.

In addition, this Policy does not place a new process on sport. As such, Sport Integrity Australia is not authorised to handle complaints that have happened after the Disputes and Discipline Policy was implemented.

Poor conduct which is reported to the National Integrity Framework disciplinary process prior to the Policy implementation.

Participants can be referred to Sport Integrity Australia for a process, to manage the issue in future – for example, for intervention or support. Sport Integrity Australia can pass the information to take action on child protection issues offered through external agencies.

## How to reset password in JustGo for members

It is so hard to remember so many different usernames and passwords. Chances are there that you might not remember your login details for the JustGo database system to access your Pony Club profile. Simply click on **Forgot Password** to reset your password.

## How to reset password in JustGo for members

The system will send you the **Reset Password** link and will also highlight your username.

This email will come from the [support@ponyclubaustralia.com.au](mailto:support@ponyclubaustralia.com.au) email address and will be sent to the email address mentioned in your profile. Please check your junk and spam folders for the password reset email.

Click on the **Reset Password** link and create your new password and **Save** it. In the confirmation pop-up window, click **OK**.

You will be redirected to the login screen, now just type in your username and password and **Log In**.

## How can Clubs/Zones reset password in JustGo for members?

Even Clubs and Zones can generate the password reset link on behalf of members.

- Click on the Club Members tile.
- Search for the member
- Click on the human icon
- Click on update details
- And Password Notification

Again, please ask members to check their junk and spam folders for the password reset email, if they cannot find the email in their inbox.

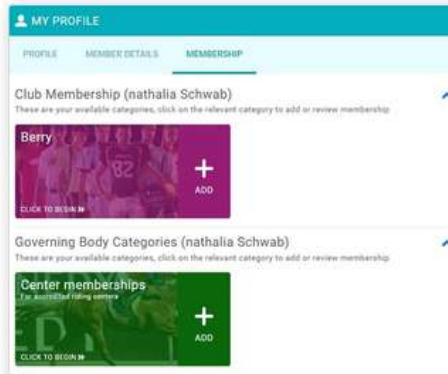


## How to renew a membership

Click on My Profile and head to **MEMBERSHIP**.

If you are part of a club, click on your **Club Membership**.

If you are part of a riding center, click on **Center Memberships**.

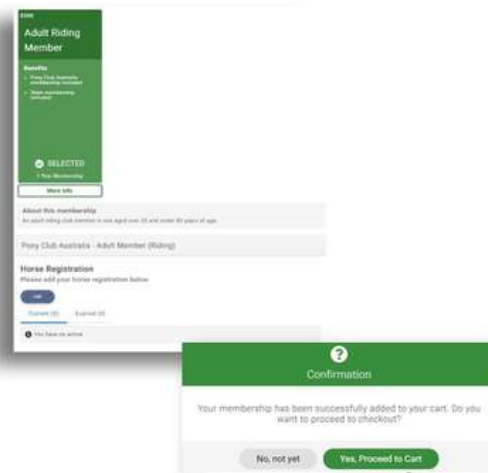


## How to purchase a membership



Select the **membership type**; only relevant memberships will be available for purchase. For example, junior riders will only see Junior Riding Membership and not Adult Riding Membership.

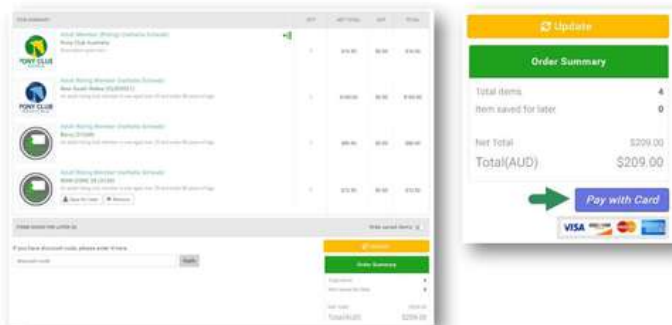
After completing all the required information, click on **Finish**, and in the pop-up, **Yes, Proceed to Cart**.



## How to purchase a membership

In the cart, you can see the summary of the amount going to PCA, the State, the State Zone and your club.

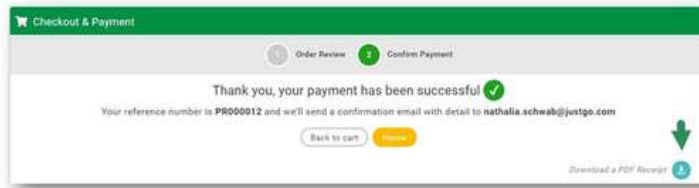
After checking everything, click on **Pay with Card**, and purchase your membership.





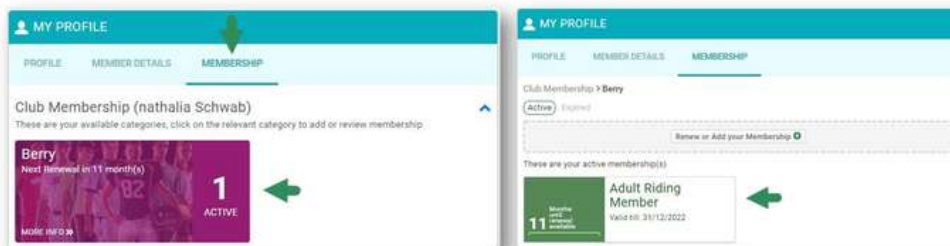
## How to download my receipt

After the purchase, you will see a message confirming your payment. To download the receipt, click on the download button in your right corner.



## How to check if my membership is active

You can check if your membership is active by heading to **MEMBERSHIP**, where you can find your membership type and expiry date by clicking on the **ACTIVE** membership.

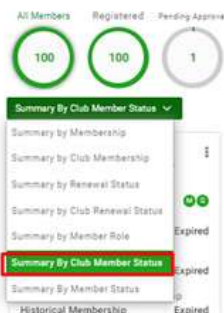


## How to approve new club members

All the new club members require club approval before they can purchase any club memberships. Existing club members are allowed to purchase memberships directly.

All the new members can be approved through the **CLUB MEMBERS** tile.

In the Club Members tile, change the green drop-down to Summary by Club Members Status.





## How to approve new club members

Then click on the **Pending Approval filter** (If you don't have a Pending Approval filter then there are no pending members for your club)

Click on three dots (next to the member name) and Approve



## How to approve transfer requests

Club Transfers can also be approved from Club Members Tile.

Clicking on the purple dropdown and select Transfer Requests

Then click on the three dots next to the member's name and Approve/Decline.



## Stripe Express Link and User Guide

All the clubs and zones will have to change their existing Stripe account to Stripe Express Account. To help with the transition, JustGo will run number of Stripe Express set up webinar sessions. These sessions are state wise and session timings and dates have been decided in consultation with the state bodies. During all the sessions, JustGo representatives will be present to answer questions and help clubs and zones with their queries. Clubs and Zones can also reach out to [Support@justgo.com](mailto:Support@justgo.com) if they have any stripe related questions after the webinar session.

State bodies are responsible for communicating the dates and timing of the Stripe Express webinar session. Please contact your state, if you haven't yet received the links, dates or timings of the sessions.
