

What is cardiac arrest?

A cardiac arrest is when your heart stops beating. This means that your brain and vital organs are starved of oxygen; you become unconscious and stop breathing or do not breathe normally. A cardiac arrest is a medical emergency.

Every minute counts when a person is in cardiac arrest. Without chest compressions and use of a defibrillator, a person in cardiac arrest will not survive.

A cardiac arrest can be survived if you get appropriate help. If you see someone in this situation, call Triple Zero (000) immediately. The call operator can talk you through what to do. Any attempt at resuscitation is better than no attempt.

What is a defibrillator (AED or Automated External Defibrillator)?

An automated external defibrillator (AED) is a portable electronic device that diagnoses life-threatening abnormal heart rhythms that can cause a cardiac arrest.

An AED might be able to treat these abnormal heart rhythms by giving an electric shock to try to 'restart' the heart to its normal rhythm. This is known as defibrillation.

An automated external defibrillator (AED) will only give a shock if it is necessary. You cannot do any harm by using an automated external defibrillator (AED) on someone who is unconscious.

The table in this document contains information of the current grants available nationwide and in your State that are open for applications. This may assist your club with an opportunity to access government funded grants and subsidies to put towards AED equipment and training. Victoria	 Emergency Sporting Equipment Grant Program This grant provides assistance to grassroots sport and active recreation clubs and organisations to replace essential sporting or first aid equipment that has been lost or destroyed as a consequence of fire, flood, significant storm event, theft, or criminal damage. Grants of up to \$2,000 are available towards the replacement cost of lost or damaged equipment that is owned by the applicant organisation. Essential equipment is: Equipment that is required for ongoing participation in an activity that is transferable to other participants and remains the property of the club/organisation (i.e. bats, match balls, equestrian jumps, racquets, gymnastic mats, team equipment kits and badminton nets) Injury prevention equipment that is transferable (i.e. goal post padding, batting pads, gloves, goalie gear, helmets and catcher's gear) First aid equipment which is necessary for immediate attention to injury that may occur during participation in sport or active recreation. 	https://sport.vic.gov.au/grants-and- funding/our-grants/emergency- sporting-and-recreational-equipment	Applications can be submitted at any time between 1 June 2022 and 31 May 2023.
